PUPPETS IN JULY

Will bring the magic and engaging artistry of puppetry to new audiences in dlr Lexlcon, Dún Laoghaire this summer. A lively programme is planned over three weekends in July with a mix of Irish and international puppeteers visiting from Bulgaria, Spain and Italy.

This programme will include Allegro Vivace brought to us by the Bulgarian Varna State Puppet Theatre, Mamulengo puppetry from Trapusteros Teatro visiting us from Spain with a type of puppet performance popular in North East Brazil, and Gianluca di Matteo with his traditional Neapolitan puppet show: Le Guarattelle di Pulcinella.

With a mix of events both indoors and outdoors dlr Lexlcon will showcase some of the best known Irish puppeteers that work to keep the beautiful art of puppetry alive. Julie Rose Mc Cormick, Sinead Lynch, Your Mans puppets, Púca Puppets, Marie Denham and Margot Jones will bring their unique puppetry to enliven our library spaces!

Alongside puppet shows we have two talks: one on famous Irish puppeteer Eugene Lambert and one on Victorian Marionettes as well as an exhibition of rare Burmese Puppets.

Kindly supported by Irish UNIMA and Creative Ireland. Irish Unima aims to promote the activities of Irish puppeteers and the art form of puppetry in Ireland and abroad. As well as providing a forum for its development, it creates the link between Irish Puppeteers and the international stage.

EXHIBITION OF BURMESE MARIONETTES

Burma (Myanmar) has a centuries-old tradition of puppets. They were much used for court entertainment until the British occupation in the later nineteenth century, when the older repertoire and characters (mythological, animals and humans) were gradually replaced by new stories and figures. This exhibition has a combination of modern figures and ones associated with the older repertoire. With their highly-coloured and decorated costumes they give a picture of one of the more significant forms of Asian puppetry. John Mc Cormick will give a short talk on Burmese puppets in the context of the exhibition.

After a concert in a large theatre, the performers put down various bits and pieces on a table backstage and depart for the night. The things they have left then come to life, become characters, and put on a delightful musical performance of their own in which they show their amazing abilities. When the actors return in the morning, everything is in its right place... or is it? This is an entertaining show for children of all ages in which there are no rules and in which classical music is mixed with other styles of music to make the point that it is all music. We welcome Varna State Puppet Theatre who visit us in Dún Laoghaire all the way from Bulgaria for these special performances. Varna State Puppet Theatre is supported by *The Golden Dolphin*, a non-profit organization to which all the actors belong. *The Golden Dolphin* produces performances for spectators of various ages: classical and modern pieces for children, entertaining and avant-garde productions for adults, and educational performances for students. Since 1972, together with the Ministry of Culture, the Municipality of Varna and The State Puppet Theatre Varna, the Golden Dolphin has organised an International Puppet Festival which is held every three years.

Allegro Vivace is an actors' production devised by Vera Stoykova, Diana Tsolevska, Galin Ginev, Stoyan Stoyanov with scenography by Ognyana Serafimova.

THROWING VOICES AND PULLING STRINGS: THE LIFE AND TIMES OF IRELAND'S 'PUPPETEER LAUREATE'

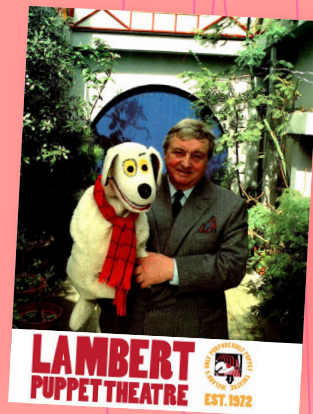

Eugene Lambert was a multi-talented actor, puppeteer and ventriloquist on stage, radio and television across seven decades of Irish entertainment. Ireland's Jim Henson worked with Neil Jordan, Laurel & Hardy, Maureen Potter and Micheál Mac Liammóir.

The pioneering puppeteer was behind the characters of Wanderly Wagon and Bosco and was the creator of Ireland's National Children's Theatre in the form of the Lambert Puppet Theatre in Monkstown, Co. Dublin.

Eugene's adventures included being arrested in Britain for army desertion and arrested in Ireland for acquiring a driver's licence for his ventriloquist's dummy!

Your tour guide for this trip down memory lane is Martin Molony, who is a communications lecturer and social historian at Dublin City University, specialising in the history of Irish puppetry.

**THE VICTORIAN MARIONETTE THEATRE,
EXHIBITION AND DEMONSTRATION**

Marionettes (jointed figures operated from above) were a very popular form of entertainment in the nineteenth century. Perceived as miniature actors, they often performed the same repertoire as the live theatre. Like other European marionettes the usual mode of operation was by means of a stout rod inserted into the head, but by the 1850s performers in Britain and Ireland had disposed of this in favour of a figure operated entirely by strings, and this technical change opened the way for an extended repertoire of trick or speciality acts. The talk will be illustrated by a number of these acts.

MAMULENGO

Puppeteer: Trapusteros Teatro

Mamulengo de la Mancha proposes an encounter between Cervantes' Spain and the Brazilian popular puppet theatre, Mamulengo. In the show, Don Quixote and Sancho Panza leave 17th century Spain and land in the 21st century, in the port of Recife and in the middle of the carnival. Crossing the imaginary Lake of Castile (or the Atlantic Ocean), the two adventurers are arrested by the local police and treated like illegal immigrants, castaways who do not know the local language. From there, they meet characters from Mamulengo, local inhabitants of the Northeast.

The first part of the story is staged with Shadow Theatre and narrates the adventures of Don Quixote and Sancho Panza while still in Spain. In the second part, which takes place in Brazil, the show is performed with Mamulengo puppets. The two actors, two shadow-puppeteers, merge their shadows and silhouettes with the puppets, which originate from various master Mamulengueiros from Pernambuco.

Trapusteros Teatro was founded in 2004 by Marcos Pena and is based in the small town of Aguinaliu in the pre-Pyrenees. Here the company acquired a ruined hut which they converted into a 70-seat theatre, La Borda del Titere, where they hold regular festivals. In 2011, Trapusteros was joined by Izabela Brochado from Brazil, who has a long experience of studying and performing with the Mamulengo puppets of Pernambuco. In 2006, Trinity College Dublin awarded Izabela a PhD for her study of the Mamulengo and now she divides her time between Spain and Brazil, where she teaches at the University of Brasilia.

Le Guarattelle di Pulcinella is a traditional Italian puppet show featuring Pulcinella, a close relative of Mr. Punch. The show shares many elements with its counterparts, infused with the warmth of the Mediterranean. Its roots are ancient, tackling profound themes in a fun and engaging way. The narrative is driven by a rhythm that captivates the audience from the very first scenes, making it suitable for all kinds of audiences.

Gianluca Di Matteo has been involved in puppetry and the broader field of figure theatre since 2000. Throughout his career, he has performed in 22 countries. A master of the Neapolitan puppetry tradition, Gianluca is one of the few who continue to preserve and evolve this art form. He carves his puppets from wood and conducts educational workshops for primary school children. He also offers courses for actors and puppeteers.

Gianluca will include a workshop/ demonstration after the performance.
