Take a guided tour of this wonderful country house. Hear the story of how the original 17th century house, The Grange, was purchased in 1764 by David La Touche of French Huguenot origin, extended, renamed Marlay, and then sold in 1864 to Robert Tedcastle, the well known Dublin coal merchant. The Tedcastle family lived at Marlay until 1925. In 1925 Philip Love (a market gardener, who at one time was the largest tomato producer in Ireland) acquired the House.

Meet at the front steps of Marlay House, Marlay Park, Rathfarnham, Co. Dublin.

THE IRISH COUNTRY HOUSE AND THE GREAT FAMINE

Marlay House, Wednesday 2 April, 7pm



Using a number of case studies, this talk examines how the country house and its owners functioned in a time of famine. While some were remembered for their benevolence during the Famine, others were castigated for their in-action, which ultimately fed into the stereotypical depiction of the country house towards the end of the nineteenth century and later.

Dr Ciarán Reilly is a historian of 19th & 20th century Irish History at the Department of History, Maynooth University, and Assistant Director of the Centre for the Study of Historic Irish Houses & Estates. He is the author of a number of books on the Great Irish Famine, including *The Irish Land Agent*, 1830-1860; *Strokestown and the Great Famine*, and *John Plunket Joly and the Great Famine in King's County*. He is also coeditor of *Dublin and the Great Famine*.

A talk by Rob Goodbody, local historian

One of Dun Laoghaire-Rathdown's newest parks is Fernhill, near Stepaside. However, the gardens at Fernhill are not new and have evolved over more than two centuries. This talk examines how the gardens have progressed over time, managed by the Darley and Walker families and how Fernhill came to be opened as a magnificent public park.

EVIE HONE STAINED GLASS ARTIST OF MARLAY

A talk by Peadar Curran, local historian

Having initially established a reputation as a painter in oils and gouaches, in 1933 Evie Hone started to experiment in the medium of stained glass. It is for her work in this field that she is best known and with Harry Clarke and Michael Healy is recognised as the leading Irish artists in this field. Evie entered An Túr Gloine and remained there until the co-operative was dissolved following the death of Sarah Purser in 1944. As she was living in the Dower House in the courtyard of Marlay, Evie was able to setup her own studio in Marlay House.

Evie Hone died in March 1955 on her way to mass in Rathfarnham so our talk marks the 70th anniversary of her passing and takes place in the room next door to her studio in Marlay House.
